

An Ordinance regulating junk dealers, the establishment and maintenance of junk yards, including, but not limited to automobile junk or grave yards, the storage and disposal of scrap, refuse and junked articles, providing for the issuance of licenses for junk dealers and for the maintenance and operation of junk yards under prescribed conditions, prescribing remedies for the abatement of nuisances and unlicensed junk yards and scrap yards, prescribing penalties for violators and providing for the revocation of licenses in the event of non-compliance.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors, Reed Township, Dauphin County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same and pursuant to the authority of the same and pursuant to the authority granted by the Act of Legislature approved May 1, 1933, P. L. 103, as amended as follows:

Section 1. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as "Reed Township Junkyard and Refuse Ordinance".

Section 2. Definitions. Unless otherwise expressly stated, the following words and phrases shall be construed throughout this ordinance to have the meanings herein indicated:

- A. Person. Shall include any partnership, association, firm or corporation.
- B. Township. Shall mean Reed Township, Dauphin County, Pa.
- C. Board. Shall mean the Board of Supervisors of Reed Township.
- D. Junkyard. Shall mean any place where any junk as hereinafter defined, is stored, disposed of or accumulated.
- E. Junk. Shall mean any discarded material or article and shall include, but not be limited to, scrap metal, scrapped, abandoned or junked motor vehicles, machinery, equipment, paper, glass, containers and structures. It shall not include, however, refuse
